Dave Perry:

- We're increasing clients every week
- Went from 305 to 350 over the last month
- This is positive because the word is getting out there for new clients to know that we are there

Wendy Garf-Lipp:

- We are beginning to see things that are not covered by Food Stamps, i.e. toilet papers etc.
- We are able to distribute it through the school department

Pam:

- We are starting to see an uptick of clients
 - o This comes as the same time that the unemployment benefits have come down
- We have decided to lease a large truck for refrigeration – this will work short term for the next month
- We are continuing to get 2 deliveries from Elliot Farm of produce per week
- We are continuing looking for locations for the South end of NB Distribution

Desa VanLaarhoven:

- Week 20 of project Manifest Love
- Just completed a survey to the participants to fill out
- One of the things we did early on was send out homemade laundry detergent
 - o The survey said that clients want that back
- 135 full shares per week through NorthStar, YWCA and YOU and BCC
 - o Along with 100 families of extra veggies heading to Westport
- We are planting squash and beans for late fall crops to continue

Liz:

- Is there opportunity to get the consumer survey out to these participants

Desa VanLaarhoven:

- Yes, and this survey was to assess the impacts of what the impacts of this program was.

Liz:

- We launched the consumer survey last week
- Currently we only have responses in English and predominantly white women (94% currently)
- Everyone should have the link, and if you need paper copies please get them from us
- Ideally these would be focus group, but because of Covid-19 these surveys are even more important

John Little:

- We are seeing a decrease in our numbers over the last couple of months, so hopefully people are getting food through pop-ups
- I have a question about the new USDA mixed food boxes

Victoria Grasela:

- We are waiting for the final numbers, and a finalized plan on how we are going to get the boxes out.
- The content of the boxes can be delivered separate



- They have to prove that the families are getting the individual boxes, but don't have to be sent out that way
- These boxes will be focused on going through the Food pantries as well as some of the partners such as Immigrants assistance and CEDC

Liz:

- The Westport food pantry is looking to see if they can get help while applying for 501(C)3 status

Wendy Garf-Lipp:

- Marcia Picard may be able to help, as they are a Westport org, and have other organizations under their umbrella.

Karen Schwalbe:

- Welcome Olivia Hart is SEMAPs new outreach and communication person
- There is a meeting tonight to review draft regulations for FISMA (Food Safety and regulation act) – see link
 - o This will affect farmers markets
 - o There is also a two-week comment period
