MI Welcomes New SFPC Program Manager, Christine Smith

We're pleased to announce that we have a new Program Manager for the Southcoast Food Policy Council, Christine Smith! Christine is excited to add to the critical and ongoing work of the Southcoast Food Policy Council.

Discovering the root causes of the injustices in the world drew Christine into advocacy, organizing and education. In collaboration with other partners, Christine worked on a yearly advocacy day at the Capitol in Maryland to address poverty-related issues, including food access, housing and immigration. She collaborated with partners to provide legislative issue briefings, divided people into districts, and helped them organize and build relationships with lawmakers. Later, Christine worked with national partners to host yearly a three-day conference with other organizations to educate leaders from across the USA to lobby their Congressional legislators in Washington, DC.



When working on legislative immigration issues, Christine realized there was no safe space to have difficult dialogues and that as a society, we did not have the listening skills to address immigration reform. Working with national Peacebuilding experts, Christine provided people in Idaho a safe space to share and acquire skillsets in active listening and dialogue. She is thrilled to work with the Marion Institute to support the Southcoast Food Policy Council's goal of advocating for food justice and food security.
