New Business:

David Perry, Greater Fall River Community Food Pantry

- November numbers 491 families, (1,575 clients), up 30 families from October. 952 children under age 18, 497 ages 18-64, 126 people over age 65. Seeing more Latinx families. Have plenty of food.
- 465 turkeys, still have turkeys to give away, giving \$40 gift card

Marcia Picard, Fall River Public Schools/Groundworks Southcoast

- Y Global market-, gave away food for 200 families, drive though, large variety of food
- Partners for Healthy and Conservation Law Center- 9 communities; surveying hundreds of people with social determinants of health. Discovered something slightly disturbing- where do you get your information and how much do you trust these sources? Highest rated information getting from family and friends. It would be interesting to compare Fall River Info and New Bedford information.

Food Finder and Food Lists

- Food Finder too complicated and not user friendly. Maybe zip code listing, and can print the Food Finder.
- There is no fee for the listserv, it is a google listserv. The only fee is for https://foodfinder.marioninstitute.org/.
- With client, a static sheet is best, as long as it is updated weekly. People like the printed copy with a date on it so we know how old it is. Print small amount because constant updates. Tell clients to call before they show up at food pantry in case pantry is closed.

Lorraine Khazan, PACE

- Director of HR, but started by running the food programs. Expanded from food closet to stand alone program. Not yet in new building and hope to be in by spring 2022. This will incorporate wrap-around services, on Park Street between Smith and Parker.
- Thanksgiving distribution, at least 500 families, more people asked for gift cards than turkeys. Going to distribute the rest of the turkeys for Christmas.

SOUTHCOAST FOOD POLICY COUNCIL

Buddy Andrade, New Bedford Development Corp.

- 110 turkeys and gift cards, and gift cards good response. Thank you United Way New Bedford.
- We are happy to have Coastal Foodmoving into the Old Bedford Village office to host a winter's farms market. In the last two months much has happened such as how to bring education on food nutrition. Tuesday was the first day with Coastal FoodShed Farmers's Market and it was a success and will be there all winter and outside in the spring.
- Old Bedford Village is at 41 Bedford Street, New Bedford, across the street from Serenity Garden. This is also the site of the Old Morse Cutting Tools. The City just received funding to do more clearn up and invest in infrastructure. We would like to see a year-around Food Hub of sorts. Jan 19 is the last meeting of the Local Food, Local Places and thanks to Liz to helping to make this happen.

Rachael Sirois, United Way of Greater Fall River

- COVID new way- this year have Butterball gift certificates and can be used at any grocery store. Allison Hague, Family Resource Center

- Hybrid model due to increasing COVID numbers. Still helping with housing, toilets, referrals, basic needs, school related issues, and mental health huge barrier.
- Takes 8-10 weeks to get a mental health counselor or psychiatry, especially youth, lots of grief with over-dosing and loss of cancer. Biggest barrier is mental health with children and youth because system is over-whelmed. Even group mental health programs meeting less because COVID.
- Surgeon General said we are in mental health crisis for youth nationally.
- Lots of recruitment for tele-health.

Wendy Garf-Lipp, United Neighbors of Fall River

• Mental health program for youth- 6 different school, and 15 kids in each school. Just a drop in the bucket.

- Finished Thanksgiving pantries, getting ready for Christmas harvest.
